The International System

Its material and normative dimension encompasses the socio-historical element, in the context of globalization, the fragmentation of society due to economic and political inequalities, and the hegemony of major powers within organizations.



International Law

It encompasses the regulation of borders, peace treaties, the emergence of the sovereign state, the structure of the various international organizations, and cooperation among states in different fields.



State Sovereignty

It constitutes voluntarism in the creation and application of international norms, under the principles of neutrality and non-intervention, absence of hierarchy among norms, specificity, and validity.

Human rights

They are protected through Conventions and Declarations, such as the American Declaration of the Rights and Duties of Man and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.



International Norms

It regulates the content and factors of the material and formal sources, which are governed by conventions, custom, principles, judicial decisions, doctrine, jurisprudence as a form of interpretation and determination, and jus cogens as norms superior to conventional ones.
